	Educational planningshould aim at meeting the educational needs of the entire population irrespective of their age. While the traditional structure of education has a three-layer hierarchy from the primary stage to the university represents the core, we should not overlook the periphery which is equally important. Under modern conditions, workers need to rewind or renew their enthusiasm, strike out in a new direction, or improve their skills as much as any University professor. The retired and the aged have their own needs as well. Educational planning, in other words, should take care of the needs of everyone. Our structures of education have been built-up on the assumption that there is a terminal point to education. This basic defect has become all the more harmful today. A UNESCO report certified 'Learning to Be' prepared by Edgar Faure and others in 1973 asserts that the education of children must prepare future adults for various forms of self-learning. Aviable education system of the future should consist of modules with different kinds of functions serving a diversity of constituents and performance, not the period of study, which should be the basis for credentials. In view of the fact that the significance of a commitment to lifelong learning and lifetime education is being discussed only in recent years even in educationally advanced countries, the possibility of an idea becoming an integral part of educational thinking seems to be a far cry. To move in this direction means much more than some simple rearrangements of the present organization of educations. But a good beginning can be made by developing open university programs for older learners of different categories and introducing extension services in conventional colleges and schools. These institutions should also learn to cooperate with community organizations such as libraries, health services, etc. (Source: Enrich Forum 04)
